### October's Mission Partner of the Month: The Barnes House

Located just a few blocks from Asbury, The Barnes House, a program of Union Mission, provides permanent supportive housing for up to 16 single formerly homeless women who have physical and/or mental disabilities. Through this program, ladies receive supportive services such as case management and community resource referrals.

How can you help Asbury partner with The Barnes House?

### 1) Donate gently used or new items to The Barnes House

You can help partner by bringing these items to the Connection Corner. They will immediately be put to good use.

<u>Consider donating gently used items if you have unused extras:</u> bath and kitchen towels, wash cloths, socks, twin sheets. We're also looking for a gently used couch, two chairs, side tables, lamps, and artwork to make the family room as comfortable as possible.

<u>Consider donating new items if it's in your budget:</u> laundry detergent, full-size bottles of body wash, women's underwear (sizes large or extra large)

### November's Mission Partner of the Month:

### The Family Justice Center

Also located just a few blocks from Asbury on Waters and 36th, The Family Justice Center will soon be a comprehensive support location for victims of domestic violence all under one roof. Partners offering services at this one location will be the Rape Crisis Center of the Coastal Empire, the Savannah Area Family Emergency (SAFE) shelter Center for Domestic Violence Services, the Coastal Area Children's Advocacy Center, the Mediation Center of the Coastal Empire, the Savannah Police department's Family Violence Unit, etc.

How can you help Asbury partner with The Family Justice Center?

- 1) Helping Hands will be leading a group for the next multifaith 'Congregations in Service' event, Saturday, November 9, to do final cleaning and set up before The Family Justice Center's soft opening.
- 2) There will be another 'Congregations in Service' option also on Saturday, November 9 to 'tie' blankets for use at the Center.
- 3) If you'd rather knit at home, you can also knit small 'take with you' blankets and soft toys for clients to use at the Family Justice Center and take home after receiving services.

### Legislative Contact Information

If you have never contacted your legislator before it can be intimidating to make a cold call. If you call during office hours staff will answer and take your message. If you call after hours you can leave a voice message.

Here is a sample script to get you started.

"Hello Representative Carter. I am a constituent and live in Savannah. I am calling today to urge you to vote for and support legislation that protects our coast line. I feel strongly that we must do everything possible to prevent any activities that will threaten our wildlife or endanger the coastal habitat. Thank you for your attention to this matter."

Whatever message you are giving be sure to say you are a constituent, be clear about what you are for or against, and politeness counts. Why is this important? The staff actually tabulates the phone calls. Please add these numbers to your phone contact list so that calling your legislators will be easy. (See next page)

### **Suicide Prevention and Awareness**

September was Suicide Prevention and Awareness Month. With the powerful presentations from the pulpit, it was decided to include this article again. While suicide prevention is important to address year-round, Suicide Prevention and Awareness Month provides a dedicated time to come together with collective passion and strength around a difficult topic. The truth is, we can all benefit from honest conversations about mental health conditions and suicide, because just one conversation can change a life.

Suicidal thoughts, much like mental health conditions, can affect anyone regardless of age, gender or background. In fact, suicide is often the result of an untreated mental health condition. Suicidal thoughts, although common, should not be considered normal and often indicate more serious issues.

It can be frightening if someone you love talks about suicidal thoughts. It can be even more frightening if you find yourself thinking about dying or giving up on life. Not taking these kinds of thoughts seriously can have devastating outcomes, as suicide is a permanent solution to (often) temporary problems.

## THIS IS ASBURY MEMORIAL'S BIGGEST FUNDRAISING EVENT. VOLUNTEER TO HELP MAKE IT A SUCCESS!

If you have volunteered for the Pecan & Honey Harvest before—or if you have just joined the congregation—please consider volunteering this year for one or more of the activities below. The volunteers have as much (or more) fun than the visitors!

### Sorting and Packaging Shelled Pecans (November 3-15)

We obtain the finest quality Georgia pecans directly from the orchard. Although they have gone through the shelling process, we still must insure there are no shells remaining in the nuts. Pecan pickers sort through our 500 plus pounds of nuts, separating the whole halves from broken pieces and removing any shell pieces. Then they package them into one pound and half-pound bags. This work can be done independently or in small groups in our second floor sorting room.

### Home-Baking of Pecan and/or Honey-Related Goods for Sale at the Harvest (November 15-22)

Home Bakers prepare their favorite cookie and snack recipes and package them in small bags for sale in the Country Café (we suggest two dozen bags per baker). In keeping with the theme, each recipe needs to contain pecans and/or honey. We also welcome whole cakes and breads. Beginning November 3rd, you can pick up shelled pecans for your cooking.

### Baking Pecan Cheese Bites (November 15) and Packaging Them for Sale (November 18-19)

We need four or five folks to help bake cheese bites in the church kitchen ovens. We will be baking over the entire day, but we welcome those who can only help for a shorter period. We will package the cheese bites for sale early the next week.

### Packaging Home-Baked Products for Sale (November 22)

Beginning at 9 am, we will need volunteers to receive, package, and label our food products for sale.

### Logistics Team (November 22 and November 24)

This group loads/unloads the sales product and the necessary equipment (tables, chairs, stage, etc.) to/from the truck. We need at least six to eight people with good backs at 4 pm on Friday, November 22, to load the truck. Then on Sunday, November 24, after the worship service, to unload the truck.

### Event Set Up/Tear Down (8 am and 3 pm November 23)

We need at least ten volunteers to unload and reload the truck at Madison Square. They also will assist in setting up/breaking down the tables and chairs.

### Working in the Country Store and Country Café on the Day of the Event (November 23)

Volunteers for this activity will be our sales force. They should be prepared to prepare product samples and to interact with the customers to market all our products and to make sales. Additionally you will help the store coordinator set up and take down the tables. There will be several shifts, which makes it easier on any one volunteer and enables a greater number of people to volunteer.
