

We remember the great ancestors of our faith, from Abraham and Sarah, to Paul and Phoebe: **Ancestors of the faith, we remember you.**

We remember the prophets and priests, the ministers and teachers who have taught us the way of God: **Teachers of the faith, we remember you.**

We remember our grandparents and parents, aunts and uncles, those who have gone before us in our lifetime: **Family of our faith, we remember you.**

We lift up the memories of children and grandchildren, brothers and sisters, husbands and wives and parents whose lives ended too soon:

Those close in our heart, we remember you.

We lift up to You, O God,

the names of those we have lost in this past year from our lives, knowing that they are with Your heart forever.

As we read these names, we pause to remember, pray, and give thanks for those who have touched our lives.

(Reading of the names of Loved Ones who have died since our last All Saints Sunday.)

Invitation and Prayer for Holy Communion

One: The peace of Christ be with you. All: And also with you.

One:

We gather around this table at the invitation of our God and in communion with generations past and generations yet unborn. At your table, O God, we receive the gift of bread and cup. These are the symbols you provide that remind us of your love. We thank you, Almighty God, for creating the gift of life. We thank you for the life and ministry of Jesus and for the sustaining work of the Holy Spirit. We thank you for the faithful living of saints for all centuries. We thank you for the witness of those who gave their lives in your service. In the presence of this cloud of witnesses, we gather around this table and remember that on the night of betraval and desertion, Jesus gathered with his disciples for the Passover meal. He blessed and broke the bread, saying: "This is my body which is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me." We remember that in the same way Jesus took the cup, after supper, and said: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this as often as you drink, in remembrance of me."

Let us pray:

Eternal God, we stand in sacred community with all the faithful

and before these gifts of your love. We ask you to send your Holy Spirit

on this bread and on this wine and on us.

Strengthen your universal church

that it may be the champion of peace and justice in all the world.

Restore the earth with your grace

that it is able to make all things new.
