

We remember the great ancestors of our faith, from Abraham and Sarah, to Paul and Phoebe:

We remember the prophets and priests, the ministers and teachers who have taught us the way of God:

Teachers of the faith, we remember you.

We remember our grandparents and parents, aunts and uncles, those who have gone before us in our lifetime:

Family of our faith, we remember you.

We lift up the memories of children and grandchildren, brothers and sisters, husbands and wives and parents whose lives ended too soon:

Those close in our heart, we remember you.

We lift up to You, O God,

the names of those we have lost in this past year from our lives, knowing that they are with Your heart forever.

We remember that in the same way Jesus took the cup, after supper, and said: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood.
Do this as often as you drink, in remembrance of me."

Eternal God,

we stand in sacred community with all the faithful and before these gifts of your love.

We ask you to send your Holy Spirit on this bread and on this wine and on us.

Strengthen your universal church that it may be the champion of peace and justice in all the world. Restore the earth with your grace that it is able to make all things new.
